

Key to the Parts of the CIP

1. Main Entry – Primary author (if more than one author, others are added entries)
2. Title Proper followed by other title information (subtitle, in this case)
3. Statement of Responsibility
4. Physical Description (not complete because the book was not printed yet)
5. Series Title (You do NOT put this in parentheses in the MARC record.)
6. Bibliographical and index note.
7. Summary note
8. ISBN Number
9. Library of Congress Subject Headings (with subdivisions)
10. Annotated Card (children's) headings – Similar to Sears [in brackets, if given]
11. Added Entries (These tell the librarian to generate title and series title cards if catalog cards are printed.)
12. Recommended Library of Congress Classification Code (with year of LCC ed.)
13. Recommended Dewey Decimal Classification Codes (with reference to the DDC edition used to determine number)
14. Library of Congress Control Number (LCCN – originally used to order LC catalog cards)
